Mission Statement

To glorify God by equipping students with the tools necessary to pursue a lifetime of learning so that they may discern, reason and defend truth in service to our Lord, Jesus Christ.

The Covenant School is a Christ-centered, classical, collegepreparatory K-12 institution.

Covenant is accredited by SAIS and Society for Classical Learning (SCL). Covenant is also a member of the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) and is designated a Thriving School Partner of SCL.

The Covenant School Distinctives

The Covenant curriculum is a soul-shaping endeavor in which students learn to thoughtfully engage each other, their teachers and great texts in the pursuit of all that is good, true and beautiful.

Latin: All students must take at least 2 years of Rhetoric School Latin and are encouraged to continue through AP Latin. Students take the National Latin Exam annually, regularly winning the silver Maxima Cum Laude and gold Summa Cum Laude awards.

Schedule: The Rhetoric School operates on a modified block schedule, with students taking seven courses meeting for a total of 240 minutes each week. Due to the senior thesis and rigorous course load, seniors are encouraged to schedule a study hall.

Declamation: Students memorize and perform a four-to-five minute historical speech or Shakespearean monologue each year.

Junior Advanced Ethics: Juniors spend their second semester researching, writing and presenting a controversial ethical topic of their choice. The process is composed of four parts. First, students submit a prospectus outlining the topic, its debatable nature and the authorities/sources needed to answer the question. Second, they begin to research these sources and submit an annotated bibliography summarizing and justifying each source. Third, they write and revise a research report. Finally, they condense their research into a 7 to 9-minute speech and present it before the class.

Senior Advanced Thesis: Building from the knowledge and process learned in their junior Ethics course, seniors spend their final year researching and writing a 15-page persuasive paper on a topic of their choice. The Senior Thesis project culminates in a 30-minute oral defense before a panel of judges.

Arts: The Fine and Performing Arts are considered a vital part of a classical education. A majority of students surpass the required fine arts credits and continue to pursue both academic and extracurricular arts offerings in Studio Art, Architecture, Theatre and Chamber Choir.

The Covenant School provides a classical, Christian and college-preparatory education for grades K-12. The Covenant School presently enrolls 749 students from the city of Dallas and surrounding suburbs.

Course Placement

Students are placed in courses based on academic ambition, test scores and work ethic in previous courses. Due to the demands of extracurricular athletic, fine arts and community service activities, juniors and seniors are *encouraged* to limit their number of AP courses to two per year.

Course Levels

Courses listed with no descriptor are Honors level. Their pace and rigor are elevated in line with other classical Rhetoric schools including an emphasis on research, writing, problem-solving and oral presentations in all subject areas.

Courses described as Advanced are taught at a High Honors level. Designed for students showing greater aptitude or interest in a subject area, these courses require more independent work and an even deeper level of understanding.
